IEC to Partner with Medscape on Educational Modules

The IEC is excited to announce that we are again partnering with <u>Medscape</u> to collaborate on an educational initiative for clinicians—and potentially patients—on atopic dermatitis.

The Medscape Clinical Collection will address diagnosing and managing hand eczema and will have a dedicated web page housing the educational curriculum. Activities will blend text, interactivity, and video to support learner preference. Video transcripts will be available as PDFs in English, French, German, Italian, and Spanish.

Medscape will lead development and manage logistics, including working with faculty presenters in collaboration with the IEC.

The activities will be distributed by both Medscape and the IEC, including to dermatologists, allergists, and primary care physicians. As a provider accredited by ACCME and ANCC, Medscape expects to offer continuing medical education (CME) credits to clinicians who complete the educational activities for 12 months following its publication.

The IEC and its volunteers for the project will review content development and the modules for approval prior to their release. When the educational activities are ready for distribution, the IEC will help to promote them and gain access to data on the collaboration's success.

IEC to Choose Next IEC Fellows, Plus Two Fellows Are Beginning Work

Since 2020, the IEC Fellowship Program has fostered a passion for atopic dermatitis research and management in the next generation of leaders in the field. The <u>IEC Fellowship Program page</u> now features more details and program history, and a page is dedicated to information about <u>each IEC Fellow</u>.

The IEC Board will choose our next Fellows later this year, for the IEC International Clinical Fellowship and the IEC International Research Fellowship. Both of these international fellowships are new in 2024 and greatly expanded the number of locations and mentors for potential Fellows. Chosen applicants will be paired with one of 15 mentors in eight countries.

Earlier this year, the IEC chose two Fellows for the US Clinical Fellowships:

- Vijaytha Muralidharan, MD MRCP (UK), of Dunfermline, Scotland, begins her fellowship under IEC Cofounder Dr. Amy Paller, MD, this summer through a grant funded by Pfizer.
- Mariana L. Guzmán, MD, of Santiago, Chile, will start her fellowship with Dr. Paller later this year, with funding coming from the IEC.

In January, IEC Fellow **Arbie Sofia Merilleno, MD**, of the Philippines, began the MDRI IEC Canadian Research Fellowship (announced in 2023 through partnership with the Montréal Dermatology Research Institute [MDRI]) with **Aaron Drucker, MD**, at Women's College Hospital, Toronto.


Previous years' IEC Fellows for the IEC US Research Fellowship and IEC US Clinical Fellowship were funded through the generous support of Abbvie:

- Pedro J. Gómez Arias, MD, of Spain, was paired with IEC cofounder Emma Guttman, MD PhD, for a research fellowship in 2021 at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York, NY, US.
- Antonia Reimer-Taschenbrecker, MD, of Germany, was mentored by Dr. Paller for a clinical fellowship in 2021 at the Feinberg School of Medicine at Northwestern University in Chicago, IL, US.
- Caroline Marie Thérèse Mann, MD, of Germany, was paired with Dr. Paller for a clinical fellowship in 2022.
- Sheng-Pei Wang, MD, of Taiwan, was mentored for a clinical fellowship by IEC Councilor Lawrence Eichenfeld, MD, at the University of California at San Diego and Rady Children's Hospital.

The IEC opened applications for its first Fellowships in 2020 and continues to expand the program. Each is a year-long experience open to early-career physicians from any country. Research fellowships are a 1-year on-site commitment, and clinical fellows typically work on site with an IEC Councilor for 4 weeks before returning home for the remaining 11 months to continuing the mentorship through virtual meetings, email, teleconferences, and other opportunities.

Fellows must attend a major scientific conference, present at a conference (or, optionally, conduct a chart review for the clinical fellowship), and submit an abstract or manuscript for publication in a national or international journal. Stipends ensure these opportunities aren't limited to residents of higher-income countries or those who have other means of support.

<u>What's New in Pathogenesis & Mechanisms? Drivers of Disease</u> was presented live by the IEC for a standing-room-only crowd. The symposium occurred May 15 in Dallas, TX, USA, as part of the 81st Annual Meeting of the Society for Investigative Dermatology.

More than 150 attendees engaged with IEC experts to examine the intricate molecular and immunological processes underlying atopic dermatitis (AD), novel insights into disease development, the multifaceted nature of AD, emerging therapeutic targets, and potential interventions.

The event was chaired by IEC Councilor **Emma Guttman, MD PhD**, and IEC Associate **Carolyn Jack, MDCM PhD FRCPC**. Meet the Councilor: Angela Maria Londoño Garcia, MD MSC



This issue's 'Meet the Councilor' features **Angela Maria Londoño Garcia**, **MD MSC**.

Dr. Londoño Garcia is a dermatologist, master in epidemiology and autoimmunity, and coordinator of the dermatology postgraduate program at Universidad CES in Medellin, Colombia. She is scientific coordinator of Clinic of Psoriasis and Immune-mediated Diseases (CLIPSO) and a councilor of both the IEC and International Psoriasis Council.

She presented "Immunobiologics and AD: Management of Infections and Immunization" as part of the IEC's symposium Infections and Immunization in Patients with Atopic **Dermatitis** on May 7 in Lima, Peru.

With 20 years of experience in the management of immune-mediated skin diseases, she has published on the topic in national and international journals.

How does your personal or professional vision/mission align with the new IEC vision/mission?

Since I started my professional career, my vocation has been directed to the care of patients with immune-mediated diseases. I understand and share the importance of proper management and care of patients with atopic dermatitis, the need for early care for the prevention of complications and the relevance of research in new therapies for the management of atopic dermatitis, the discussion on what should be the therapeutic goals to be achieved in our patients, and that perhaps in the not too distant future we can talk about modifying the course of the disease.

What is your proudest accomplishment in the atopic dermatitis (AD) space?

The creation of a program for the integral management of the disease, where the patient is accompanied by dermatologists, allergist, internal medicine, nutritionist, respiratory therapy, and psychology, allowing a global approach to the disease and offering the patient the best care with warmth and knowledge.

What do you value most about being involved with the IEC?

What I value most is working with great leaders in the field from whom I hope to learn and collaborate in improving the management of atopic dermatitis.

What do you think will garner the most attention over the coming year in the AD field?

The development of new therapeutic targets such as the OX-40/OX40L pathway, importance of fibroblasts as cells associated with immunological memory, early disease management, and better characterization of phenotypes.

What do you see as the biggest need among AD patients?

Shared decision making is very important when treating AD patients. With an ever-increasing number of treatment options, amplifying the patient's needs and concerns in selecting therapeutics will take on increasing importance.

What's the most recent good thing you watched, listened to, or visited?

I am a lover of history and visited Tikal in Guatemala, one of the most beautiful archaeological sites I have visited. Its greatest charm is to be in the middle of the jungle with a degree of impeccable conservation. Plus, you feel a comforting energy.
